Lonnie Carmon, of 328 S. Grant Ave. in Columbus, was a natural mechanic and inventor, for whom there was no problem that couldn't be solved if he studied long enough on it. The year his first son, Owen, was born, 1926, using a salvaged motorcycle engine and without any written plans, Lonnie built himself an airplane in his backyard. The home-built machine flew, but the pilot had to hide it in a barn in the black community of Urbancrest, for fear that jealous pilots in the Columbus Aero Club would damage it.

Lonnie's daughter, Anna, says Saturday was always airplane day and Dad would pile the family into the Franklin Sedan, drive to the flying field to give the whole family plane rides. People in the, then, south end neighborhood of Main Street and Grant Avenue would wait for Lonnie and his passengers to fly the new Piper Cub that he owned in the mid-1930s, over the neighborhood at 500 feet. On Sunday afternoons, "Dad would take his Sunday drive in the Franklin and the destination would always be Port Columbus, to watch the air machines coming and going."

Lonnie Carmon, Columbus' first Black aviator, passed away in 1955, still owning his air-
