New Solutions for Ohio's Problems

Jerry Springer, media personality and for-
mer mayor of Cincinnati

Many recognize him as the host of
"The Jerry Springer Show," which debuted
in 1991 and is viewed in over 190 U.S.
markets and 50 foreign countries.
Outside of his show, however, Springer
remains politically active, particularly in
Ohio. He has contributed large sums to
the Ohio Democratic Party and he was a
member of the Ohio delegation to the
2004 Democratic National Convention. It
is widely surmised that Springer may run
for the United States Senate against
incumbent Republican Michael DeWine
in 2006 or run for the Ohio governorship.

Bias in the Media

Jeffrey A. Dvorkin, ombudsman, National
Public Radio

In a bitterly divided country, the media
are under attack from both sides across
the nation. Media organizations have
been accused of being both too liberal
and too conservative. A recent study by
the Pew Center for the Public and the
Press looked at the state of journalism,
journalists and journalistic attitudes. It
surveyed 547 journalists in broadcasting
and print. Overall, the poll shows that
journalists are more pessimistic than ever
about the state of the profession. Their
confidence in their management is low
and their fears are high about the com-
mercial pressures on journalism. This is a
concern for all journalists, even for NPR --
a not-for-profit media outlet. Dvorkin
will discuss the strengths and weaknesses
of the recent study and what recent trends
in the industry mean for the future of the
profession.
