ner? In his book, 20th Century Sprawl: Highways and the Reshaping of the American Landscape, urban scholar Owen Gutfreund takes a "follow the money" approach to show how government policies-from as early as the 1890s-subsidized the spread of cities and fueled a chronic nationwide dependence on cars and roadbuilding, with little regard for expense, efficiency, ecological damage, or social equity.

The book traces the history of U.S. highway subsidies, and their effect on state and local highway policies, through three case studies: one large city, Denver; a small city, Middlebury,




