StoryCorps: The National Storytelling Project Comes to Columbus

David Isay, Founder and Executive Producer, *Sound Portraits Productions*

Its subjects have ranged from births to deaths to first kisses. Now the oral history project is taking to America's highways. Begun in a booth in New York's Grand Central Terminal, StoryCorps encourages friends and family members to interview loved ones for posterity - you get to keep a copy and the interview is added to the StoryCorps Archive, housed at the American Folk Life Center at the Library of Congress.

Ohio residents will have a chance to tell their stories when StoryCorps arrives in Columbus - using an Airstream trailer as recording studio

on the grounds of the Statehouse from July 5 - 25. The visit is hosted by local NPR stations 820 WOSU-AM and 90.5 WCBE-FM.

David Isay, StoryCorps' founder and president, says, "Over the past year and a half, we've seen the profound effect StoryCorps has had on the lives of those who have participated in the project, and we've seen the power that these stories have had on the millions who have heard them on National Public Radio and on the Web." Isay continues, "We believe that

listening is an act of love. StoryCorps will engage communities, teach participants to become better listeners, foster intergenerational communication, and help Americans appreciate the strength in the stories of everyday people they find all around them."

Join CMC on Tuesday, July 5 and hear David Isay discuss his inspiration for StoryCorps and its phenomenal success.
