In July of each year since 2002, the Bush Administration has withheld funding for UNFPA, the United Nations Population Fund, despite Congressional allocation. The decision whether to fund the UN agency will be made again this July. According to UNFPA, the US contribution would actually prevent 2 million unwanted pregnancies, 800,000 abortions, 77,000 infant and child deaths and 4,700 maternal deaths. It is an element of our common humanity that we were all born by the labor of a woman. Shouldn't we honor that woman? Shouldn't we, the human race, honor women by actively working to change the tragic statistics that we face today – with a woman dying every minute in childbirth – than shrug and say it is too complicated?
