Implementing Universal Women's Rights

In July of each year since 2002, the Bush Administration has withheld funding for UNFPA, the United Nations Population Fund, despite Congressional allocation. The decision whether to fund the UN agency will be made again this July. The sum in question is \$34 million, which seems small when the outcome proves so large. According to the UNFPA, the US contribution would actually prevent 2 million unwanted pregnancies, 800,000 abortions, 77,000 infant and child deaths and 4,700 maternal deaths.
