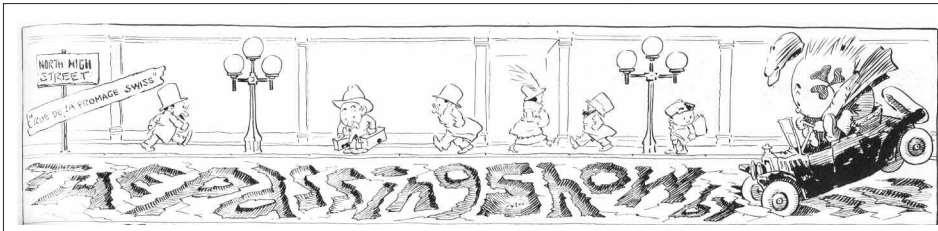

Influence of Political Cartoons: Billy Ireland of the Columbus Dispatch

By 1910, almost every major newspaper in the U.S. had at least one full-time political cartoonist. In 1922, only five years after the Pulitzer Prizes were established, the political cartoon was added to the list of categories. For over 100 years, these artists have fueled public debate and dramatized major issues

Billy Ireland was the cartoonist at the Columbus Dispatch from 1898 until his death in 1935. He was nationally famous (Will Rogers once said that Columbus had two institutions, the state capitol and Billy Ireland). His editorial cartoons were widely reprinted, but he was most famous for his Sunday feature "The Passing Show," in which he commented on any and everything,

from the High Street arches of his day to potholes in North High Street near the Ohio State campus.

One of Ireland's most important contributions to our community was his work with Dispatch publisher Robert F. Wolfe to support the clean up the Scioto riverfront after the 1913 flood (which resulted in Civic Center Dr.). His version of Carmen Ohio is a charming senorita, whom attendees will meet at the forum!
