Jurgensen to Launch Chase Excellence in Leadership Series



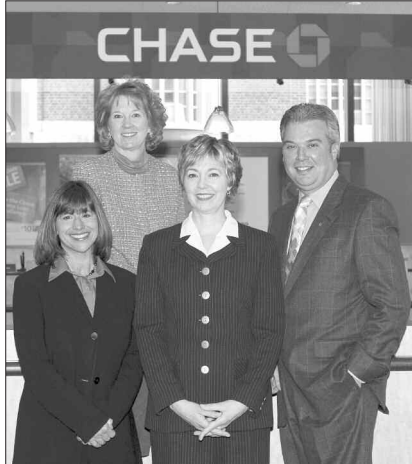
