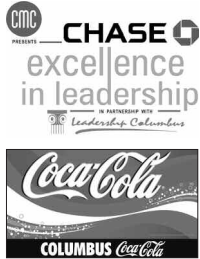

God's Troublemakers: How Women of Faith are Changing the World

Katharine Henderson, Author and Vice President, Auburn Theological Seminary in NYC.

Katharine Henderson has known many women who have taken on extraordinary challenges, correcting wrongs, drawing attention to great needs, organizing others to heal society's ills.

Henderson, an ordained minister and educator, also has made personal choices based on deep inner conviction, including founding a multifaith leadership program for teenagers from around the world.

Yet it was only recently that she began delving into the motivation behind this process of choosing a life path aimed at the greater good. It is faith? And if so, how do these values move to center stage? How does one make the choices that are most fulfilling, most "right"?

Henderson, executive vice president of Auburn Theological Seminary in NYC, will discuss the fruits of her inquiry, her book, "God's Troublemakers: How Women of Faith are

Changing the World," at noon on April 25.

The book's themes of contemplation, action and conviction are woven with the stories of more than a dozen women, Christians, Muslims and Jews - "social entrepreneurs" - who could not ignore their inner voices. The list includes Sister Helen Prejean, a nun who became an anti-death penalty activist; Ruth Messenger, a former Manhattan borough president who now directs the American Jewish World Service; Henna Hahn, who founded a center for abused Korean women; and Riffat Hassan, a Koran scholar who took up the fight against "honor killings" in Muslim countries.

Henderson also will speak about how her research led her to consider her own life and motivations.

The forum is sponsored by Religion Newswriters, a nonprofit dedicated to encouraging accuracy, balance and insight by those who cover faith issues for the mainstream media. The forum also is presented in partnership with Diversity Matters.
