City Center, downtown housing, streetcars, the redefined Lazarus landmark, RiverSouth, Arena District, Scioto Mile, Columbus State, CCAD, Columbus Museum of Art, Huntington Park, the Ohio Statehouse, COSI, 100,000 downtown employees, Ohio Theatre, Grant Medical Center, new Main Street and Rich Street bridges ----- culture, business, government, health, transportation, retail, education, sports, green space, parking From his post as CEO of the Columbus Downtown Development Corporation and Capitol South, Guy Worley has all these items on his radar.

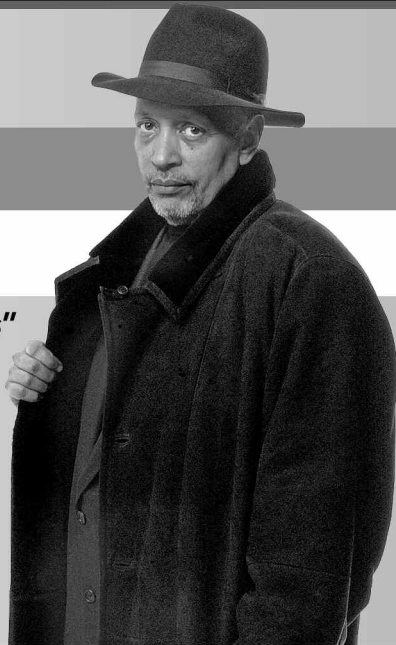
