In Monet's Garden: The Lure of Giverny

Nannette Maciejunes, Executive Director, Columbus Museum of Art

The Columbus Museum of Art launches its high-profile Monet exhibit on October 12 and runs through January 20, 2008.

The exhibit will focus on the French artist's longtime home and the subject of his famous water lily and Japanese footbridge paintings. Showcasing ten Monet paintings, the exhibit will also feature approximately ten works by American Impressionists who visited and worked at Giverny.

Following a time between the two World Wars during which the gardens experienced virtual neglect, American

artists such as Joan Mitchell and Ellsworth Kelly again visited Giverny and were influenced by the area's extraordinary sense of place and history. Artists continue to visit Monet's gardens, either through foundation grants and residency programs or individually. To complete this exhibition, twenty works by ten contemporary artists will demonstrate the enduring allure of these magnificent gardens.



A favorite of CMC audiences, Columbus Museum of Art Executive Director Nannette Maciejunes will discuss what the prestigious exhibit means to the museum and the way in which Claude Monet's gardens at Giverny have influenced generations of artists.

What is Real ID and Why Should You Care?

The "Real ID Act" is an unfunded mandate for states to begin issuing new state drivers licenses in adherence with federal standards by May 11, 2008, unless the state receives an extension. The Act aims to weave driver's licenses and state ID cards into national identification system, which would be mandatory for all "federal purposes." People in states that don't comply with the new rules will find that their current driver's license will not be accepted by any federal agency as a valid form of ID. Without the new ID, a passport would be needed at feder-Lawson Mack al buildings, national parks and domestic air travel.

Arguments are strong from advocates and proponents. Advocates insist the Real ID Act is an essential tool to fight the war on terror, but critics say it's an overly intrusive measure that raises privacy concerns. Professor Raneta Lawson Mack will discuss the controversy at CMC's October 10 forum.
