## An Interview with Steven A. Davis

In our latest installment of the Chase Excellence in Leadership Series, 10TV's Angela Pace will interview Steven A. Davis, Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive officer of Bob Evans Farms Inc.

Davis has been Chief Executive Officer at Bob Evans Farms Inc. since 2006. He inherited a company that was, by most analysts' opinions, in poor shape. Same store sales had been falling steadily for two years, and many restaurants had already closed. The company had seen profits fall eight out of nine quarters prior to the resignation of the company's previous CEO, and net income had fallen 48% from the previous year.

"When I met all the people and looked at the historical performance, I realized these are good people. They just needed a rudder," Davis told *Smart Business*. "They needed somebody to come in and say, 'Let's see what we can do.'"

Baghdad at Sunrise:

## A Brigade Commander's War in Iraq

Dr. Peter Monsoor, Colonel, U.S. Army (Retired), is currently the Chair of Military History at The Ohio State University. He is also author of the critically acclaimed book "Baghdad at Sunrise."

The memoir details his command of the 1st Brigade, 1st Armored Division—the "Ready First Combat Team"—during its first year in Iraq, from the sweltering, chaotic summer after the Ba'athists' defeat to the transfer of sovereignty to an interim Iraqi government a year later. Uniquely positioned to observe, record, and assess the events of that fateful year, Mansoor now explains what went right and wrong as the U.S. military confronted an insurgency of unexpected strength and tenacity in Baghdad in July 2003.

It was a time when Iraqi politicians were squabbling over how to create a democratic civilian government. His account has been described as masterful and the book described as "the best personal memoir of the Iraq War" by military men and critics alike.

General David Petraeus said "Baghdad at Sunrise Mansoor's superb description of his brigade's experiences during our first year in Iraq is a must read for soldiers, scholars, and policymakers alike-and all would do well to examine the lessons he draws from his experiences." is a masterful account of command in counterinsurgency operations.
