# **Bold Plans Emerge** for City Center

Unbelievably, City Center declined, slowly at first, then with alarming rapidity from its original beauty and bustle to a hollow shell with a haunting echo. We've all watched in amazement as a disappointing story unfolded for a not-so-long-ago darling of our downtown stage.

A February front page story in the Columbus Dispatch surprised nearly everyone. Keeper of City Center Mall, Capitol South Community Urban Redevelopment Authority announced plans to raze City Center and develop Columbus Commons, a community park in the heart of downtown. Apparently, the only ball left for this Grande dam was to be the wrecking ball. While comments such as "You're going to do what with City

Center?" reverberated throughout the community; Capitol South CEO Guy Worley explained that the decision-making process was open and that the group received a lot of input on how the site should be redeveloped. Worley related that the decision ultimately rested with his

15-member board of directors, who worked with Mayor Michael Coleman, other officials and consultants to determine to tear down the mall and build a park. He said that the ultimate goal is to gradually replace park land with offices, retail shops and residences when the economy strengthens.

Capitol South sought Federal stimulus dollars to defray \$15 million of the estimated \$20 million necessary to demolish the building and establish the park. The Feds denied this request, but the demo will move ahead as planned this summer.
