Tales of Shale Part I: The Business Case

For Ohioans, the Utica Shale deep underground in the eastern portion of the state offers the potential for new jobs, greater economic development in an area desperate for new industry, and a domestic source of energy to benefit the entire country. On the flip side are environmental concerns for water and land safety for people, animals and vegetation.

National and local media outlets have been covering the risks and benefits of hydraulic fracturing or "fracking." Even *Rolling Stone Magazine* included an article about it in their most recent publication, (see askcheasapeake.com for their response to the article). Recent small earthquakes in the Youngstown area have also made Ohioans question the process, and increased scrutiny about this technology.

Regardless of environmental concerns, there's no argument that there's reason to talk about fracking. The March 21 forum "Tales of Shale Part I: The Business Case" will offer three speakers with expertise in the industry to be moderated by the president and publisher of *Business First*, Don DePerro.
