

Ohio's State Budget, New and Improved

Getting a haircut for yourself or your dog may come with a slightly higher price tag if Governor Kasich's proposed budget is passed. The proposed budget still faces the scrutiny of legislators, lobbyists, and Ohio citizens before a final product is accepted.

The income side of the Kasich budget for 2014-2015 pits those of differing tax philosophies against one another. It offers reduced income tax to be offset, at least in part, by an increase in sales tax. Opponents to the budget claim that it unduly burdens lower income citizens while offering relief only for those of higher income. Proponents argue that income tax relief on higher income earners creates the opportunity and incentive for greater business investment and thereby grows the overall economy benefitting everyone.

Under the Kasich proposal, industries that will be newly subject to sales tax are legal and accounting services, trash collection, interior design service, parking lots, entertainment tickets and

even dating services, plus many others. The underlying argument is that as society has evolved from a hard goods consumer to a consumer of services, sales tax has not reflected this shift.


School funding in Ohio has been an on-going struggle for fairness across districts rural, urban and suburban. This proposed budget seeks to guarantee a certain level of funding for each district. But as each district's income changes, due to changes in student population and changes in property values, it's difficult to determine how a district's income from the State may change.

Regardless of differing opinions, the Ohio General Assembly must approve a "balanced" budget every two years.

The CMC forum on Wednesday, February 27, will examine the details of the upcoming budget and the process for acceptance. Panelist Terry Thomas has received praise for updating Richard Sheridan's book "Follow the Money: State Budgeting in Ohio."
