Affordable Care Act: Open for Business

A cornerstone of the Affordable Care Act became reality this
week as the Health Insurance Marketplace opened for business
on October 1. To weed through confusion and misinformation,
the CMC forum on October 9 will focus on the new options as a
result of the new law.

As of next year, health insurance will become mandatory
(aka, the individual mandate); those who choose no coverage
will be assessed a penalty when filing their annual income tax
returns. Health-care exchanges or the marketplace will offer a
variety of insurance plans from private insurance companies. It
is estimated that there are 1.3 million people in Ohio who should
be enrolling in the new insurance programs in the near future
with the majority of those eligible for coverage at a reduced cost.
An individual's income must be under \$45,960 or under \$94,200
for a family of four to qualify for any assistance.

Healthcare "navigators" will be hired and trained to encourage
citizens to sign-up and assist residents how to choose a plan that
fits their needs. Like any insurance, costs vary depending on
the age of the insured, where they live and tobacco use but no
one can be declined coverage or charged an extra fee for pre-
existing conditions. New customers will also have the option to
purchase varying levels of care. The navigators will be located at
many community health centers and other community centers.


