Columbus' Infant Mortality Taskforce Update

Columbus' Infant Mortality Taskforce has a goal to reduce infant mortality in Columbus/Franklin County by nearly 40% by 2020 and cut the racial disparity gap in half from the 2011 benchmark rate of 9.8 infant deaths per 1000. The next CMC forum on November 12, 2014 will provide an update on the progress and plan of action for the taskforce. The forum will be hosted by Andrew Ginther, Columbus City Council president. Other forum panelists include Michael Fiorile, president and CEO of The Dispatch Printing Company and taskforce co-chair, Erika Clark Jones, deputy director, community relations, City of Columbus, and Mysheika Roberts, assistant health commissioner and medical director, Columbus Public Health.

The leading causes of infant mortality are premature birth, congenital anomalies, sleep-related infant deaths and maternal complications with pregnancy. The taskforce's plan recommended several major themes including improving the social and economic conditions, especially in high-risk areas; improve women's health before pregnancy by increasing enrollment in health insurance and focusing on preventive care; improve reproductive health planning; improve prenatal care and access to that care. Some improvements will also be focused on the infant health care and promoting safe sleep. The taskforce
