The relationship between a community's law enforcement and justice system can shape the dynamic of a city, particularly in urban areas like Columbus. A justice system built on the presumption of innocence, a cornerstone of our nation's freedom, is only possible in a community built on a foundation of trust.

Next Wednesday's forum will feature Kim Jacobs, chief of the Columbus Division of Police, and Carter Stewart, U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of Ohio. The discussion will be hosted and moderated by Ray Miller, publisher of The Columbus African American.

Carter Stewart began his legal career in San Jose prosecuting criminal cases involving drugs, environmental infractions and illegal distribution of steroids to professional athletes. His wife's family drew him to Columbus in 2005 where he accepted a position with Vorys Sater Seymour in Pease until accepting his current position in 2009. Kim Jacobs joined the Columbus

publisher, The Columbus African American as host and moderator

Division of Police in 1979, in the early vears of women in the police force. As she worked her way up in the ranks, she involved herself in several areas of the division, including training new officers at the Academy, setting up the Citizen Police Academy, reorganizing Internal Affairs' response to citizen complaints and the new staffing and precinct redistricting plan.

The national discussion on police tactics and race relations has

been highlighted by the prominent confrontations in Ferguson, Missouri, New York City and Cleveland, Ohio. As attention is being drawn to these issues nationally, it is important to examine how Columbus fits into this picture and identify methods to improve or sustain trust between communities and law enforcement. Both community members and law enforcement officials envision the same goal— a Columbus justice system built on trust.


