

# Cartoon royalty descends on Columbus

Cartoon royalty descends on Columbus for the second annual Cartoon Crossroads Columbus, Oct. 12-16. In an event that so far has flown under most citizens' radars, CXC honors the rich cartoon history of Ohio and brings in the stars of the genre. From major feature films to internationally renowned authors and artists, CXC is truly the "Sundance" of cartooning, animation and graphic novels.



the Columbus College of Art and Design's new graphic novel major. The featured panelists scheduled are three internationally renowned talents with diverse backgrounds, Mark Osborn, Ron Wimberly and Nate Beeler.

Academy Award nominated director Osborn is best known for Kung Fu Panda, but is currently enjoying acclaim for his beautifully crafted The Little Prince, just released on Netflix. Since The Little Prince's premiere at Cannes last year, Osborne has attended 12 premieres in 12 countries. On the strength of strong reviews and fan affection for the book, The Little Prince has so far grossed more than \$97 million worldwide.

Wimberly is the artist-in-residence for both the Columbus Museum of Art and Thurber House. He is a graphic artist from Brooklyn whose work combines traditional and experimental elements to bring attention to contemporary social issues. Wimberly has worked with notable comic publishers, such as Marvel and DC comics and is the creator of the graphic novel Prince of Cats, a retelling of Romeo and Juliet







set in a mythological version of New York City at the dawn of hip-hop.

Local resident and the Columbus Dispatch's editorial cartoonist Beeler's cartoon path began when he was a sophomore writing for the Bexley High School student newspaper. Since then Beeler's cartoons have appeared in such publica-

tions as USA Today, The New York Times, the Los Angeles Times, Newsweek, Time, and U.S. News & World Report, among others. He has been featured on CNN, MSNBC, and Fox News, where viewers of "The O'Reilly Factor" officially voted him a "Pinhead." Today Beeler is one of the most widely syndicated editorial cartoonists.

Once the tome of kids and superheroes, cartooning has become respected, reviewed and treasured as both literature and art.


