Why kindness matters to a community

Speakers will be Rocky Grimes, founder, Heart of Unlimited Boundaries, Dwight Smith, chairman and CEO, Sophisticated Systems and founder, My Special Word and Kathryn Krendl, president, Otterbein University. Kelley Griesmer, SVP and manager of The Walter Family Foundation, The Columbus Foundation, will moderate the discussion.

The mission of the Kind Columbus initiative, an effort led by The Columbus Foundation, is to build community through acts of unconditional kindness.

By amplifying and enabling empathetic and compassionate actions, Kind Columbus wants to create a ripple effect of kindness that continuously inspires and fuels community members to do more good for each other and the community at large.

Explaining his passion for spreading contagious kindness, Bob Walter said, "I think what we're trying to do is to get people to be kind every day and to be thinking about that in every social situation, not just in a crisis ... we have a responsibility to help lift other people up because we all have been lifted up."

Grimes and his family share a safe go-kart driving experience with differently abled teens and young adults. Leaving his successful corporate career several years ago, he has found a way to bring joy and happiness to families.

He explains in his video (a must-see) on his website, "You can't put into words when you see what both the individuals, and their parents experience. My favorite part is to look back and see the joy in their eyes."
